2021 calendar, UPDATE 15 April

Round Four joins WorldSBK at Assen

The FIM, RKB-F1 Motorsport are delighted to announce that the fourth round of the championship will be held at Assen, the Netherlands over the weekend of 23-25 July.

This is also the fourth round of the FIM Superbike World Championship and will be the second time the sidecars join WorldSBK in 2021.

This news restores the calendar to an impressive eight rounds. As with the earlier Donington Park round, to include the FIM Sidecar World Championship together with the FIM Superbike World Championship is another breakthrough and yet further evidence of the profile and level of acceptance of World Championship Sidecar racing.

The FIM is an independent association formed by 115 National Federations throughout the world. It is recognised as the sole competent authority in motorcycle sport by the International Olympic Committee (IOC). Among its 50 FIM World Championships the main events are MotoGP, Superbike, Endurance, Motocross, Supercross, Trial, Enduro, Cross-Country Rallies and Speedway. Furthermore, the FIM is also active and involved in the following areas: public affairs, road safety, touring and protection of the environment. The FIM was the first international sports federation to impose an Environmental Code in 1994.
